Alberta-Based "One Dog, One Life" Program Launches to Support Veterans and First Responders with PTSD

"After the devastating loss of my daughter, Kadence, I witnessed firsthand the healing power of a service dog. Now, we are giving that same hope to others in her honour."

One Dog, One Life works to match highly trained service dogs with individuals facing trauma, PTSD, anxiety, and other disabilities. The program also offers education, community connection, and long-term peer and dog-handler support.

With veteran suicide and burnout rates rising, this initiative comes at a critical time for Alberta. The program is currently accepting applications for recipients, and seeking donors, trainers, sponsors, and foster families who want to be part of this meaningful mission.
